Course Content

The overall approach in the language development classes is communicative with students encouraged and facilitated to use the language learned in the classroom. The syllabus for the morning classes covers all the language skills - speaking, listening, reading and writing as well as pronunciation, vocabulary and grammar activities. Class work includes individual, pair and group work, discussions, debates, project work, presentations, written tasks and listening exercises. Each week a project topic is introduced to the class and students present their project work to the class at the end of the week.

Participants' needs are evaluated; learning objectives are set and participants receive focused feedback. Areas for improvement are addressed through revision sessions and progress tests.

Duration 1-8 weeks

Format

All courses follow the morning programme below.

ETCO2 Intensive: mornings + 5 x 50 minute lessons (2 afternoons per week) ETCO4 Super-intensive: mornings + 10 x 50 minute lessons (4 afternoons per week)
