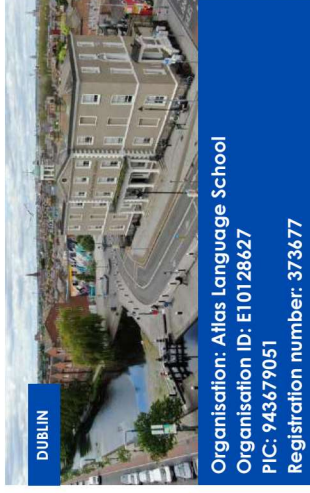

WHAT IS ERASMUS+?

Erasmus+ is an EU programme supporting education, training, youth, and sport in Europe through funded opportunities for courses, exchanges, and projects. Education staff from all sectors can apply for grants under Erasmus+ Key Action 1.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- 3** **Administrative staff** working in all areas of education are also eligible for Staff Mobility grants focusing on English language communication and professional skills.

HOW TO APPLY?

To participate in an Erasmus+ course, you must apply through an organisation, such as your university, school, training centre, or regional association that organises Erasmus+ mobilities. Check if your organisation is involved in an Erasmus+ project or applying for a project grant. Format

This Mindfulness and Wellbeing in Education course is a one-week course consisting of 20 lessons, plus 5 integrated off-site activities or excursions as part of an extensive cultural and social programme.

- 20 lessons of group tuition + 5 integrated off-site activities or excursions / week
- Duration: 1 week
- Level: Intermediate (B1)
- Location: Dublin

Follow up

Participants on the course are encouraged to keep in contact, sharing materials and experiences when back in their own classrooms. Follow-up contact is made with the participants after completion of the course to gather feedback on the effectiveness of the classroom activities presented and on how their practice has been developed.

COURSE AIMS

- 1 **Gain understanding of the principles and practices of mindfulness and emotional intelligence, and their benefits for personal and professional growth.**

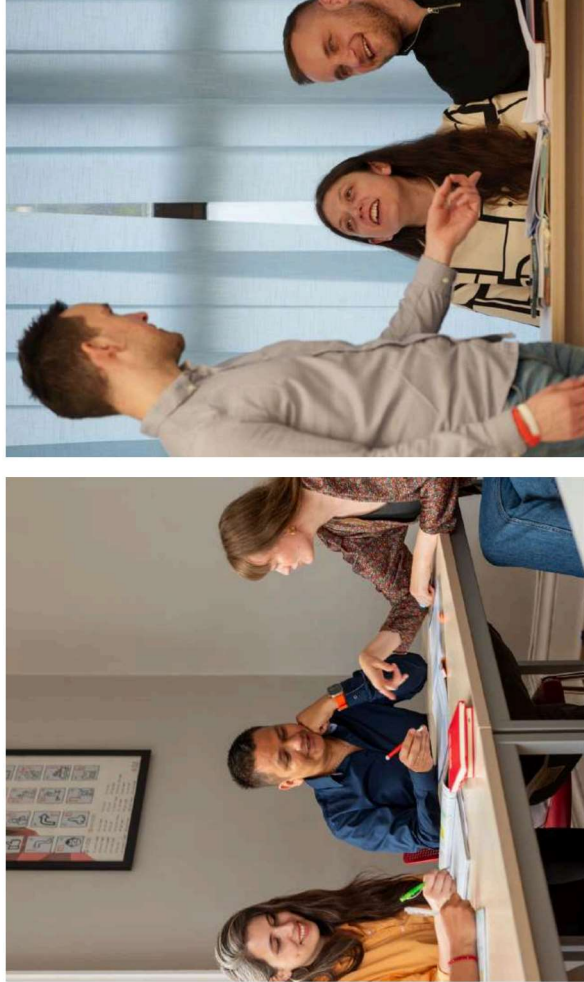

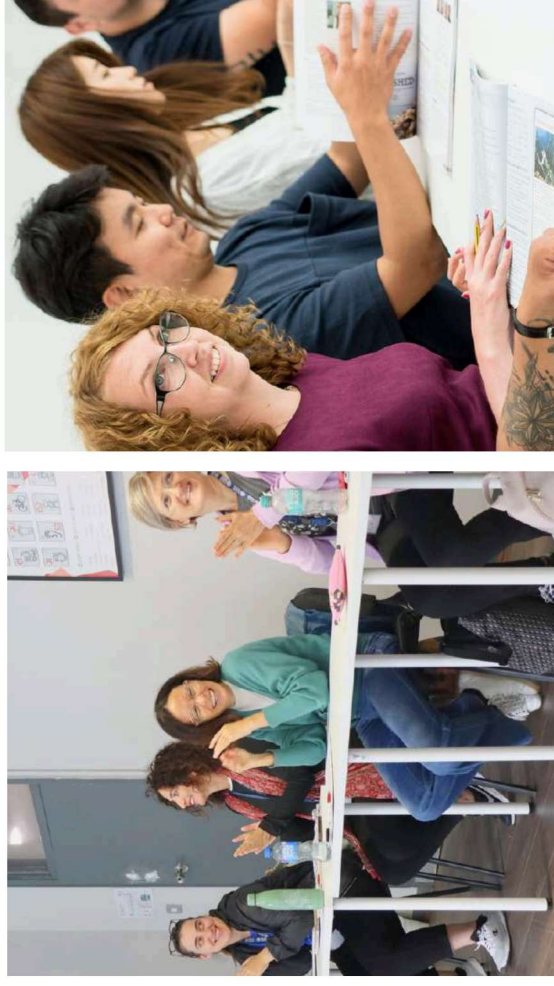

Who is this course for?

The General English Language Training with either 20 (GE20) or 26 lessons per week (GE26) is a language and skills programme that helps learners upgrade their level of English for everyday social and workplace communication, while becoming more aware of Irish or Maltese culture. This course is for teachers, students and other education professionals who need English to interact effectively with students, colleagues and friends. Participants can have any level of English from A1 (Elementary) to C1 (Advanced) to join this course.

Format

This Erasmus+ General English

Language Training course is a year-round course and can be of any duration for 1 or 2 weeks. It consists of either 20 or 26 classroom-based lessons per week, and also includes an afternoon cultural and social programme. The GE26 course offers 6 additional lessons (small group tuition).

- 5 mornings/afternoons of classes (20 lessons of group tuition) + 5 integrated off-site activities or excursions/week (GE20)
- OR
- 5 mornings or 5 afternoons of classes and an additional 2 mornings or afternoons of small-group classes (26 lessons of group tuition) + 3 integrated off-site activities or excursions / week (GE26). The small-group lessons can be General English lessons or teacher development workshops
- OR
- 20 lessons of group tuition without activities and excursions (GENA)

COURSE AIMS

By attending this General English Training course you will:

- 1 **Improve your control and flexibility over a range of grammatical structures, vocabulary, and functions to communicate ideas for a range of social and professional purposes.**
- 2 **Communicate more effectively using appropriate pronunciation without being misunderstood or asked to repeat what you have said.**
- 3 **Give a prepared presentation on a familiar topic with the main points, including such things as similarities and differences, explained with reasonable precision.**
- 4 **Write straightforward connected texts on a range of familiar subjects within your field of interest.**

METHODOLOGY

Our teaching is based on a communicative approach, which means students focus on real-life tasks, such as expressing and exchanging ideas, opinions and experiences.

Students are expected to actively participate in all pair work, small group and whole class tasks and activities. Participants should try to use new language in class, to ask questions, and to listen carefully to the teacher's feedback on how to say things better.

During the course, participants will also take part in a range of activities where they will be encouraged to develop their language skills in a more informal environment outside the classroom and further enhance their knowledge of contemporary Ireland and Malta.

- **Locations:** Dublin and Malta
- **Course Duration:** 1 week or 2 weeks
- **Level:** Elementary (A1) to Upper-Advanced (C2)

Each day there are two lessons between 9.00 am and 12.50 pm with a break in the middle.

Lessons 1 and 2 are taught by different teachers to give the learners exposure to a variety of accents and teaching styles.
