A great place to stay

Hilderstone College is located in the centre of Broadstairs, a beautiful seaside town with wonderful, golden, sandy beaches, on the south-east coast of England. It is attractive and friendly with excellent residential areas within walking distance. There is a wide choice of small shops, restaurants, coffee bars and pubs in the town centre and on the seafront. Not far from the College is a modern shopping centre, and there are cinemas, swimming pools, sports facilities and much more in the local area.

The town dates back over 700 years and has many historical connections, including to Queen Victoria, Charles Dickens and smugglers. It continues to be a popular destination for people coming on breaks and holidays, as well as to enjoy the many annual festivals and events which fill its busy calendar.

Easy to reach

Travelling to Broadstairs is easy – just one hour and twenty minutes from London by high speed train. The town is also close to the port of Dover, as well as the international stations of Ashford and Ebbsfleet. Travelling from a London airport – Gatwick, Heathrow, Stansted, or City – is simple: either take a train straight into London and catch the direct train to Broadstairs, or (from Heathrow and Gatwick) use the local airport shuttle coach service. If you prefer, we can arrange for a taxi to collect you from the airport and take you straight to your accommodation.

Learning at Hilderstone College

At Hilderstone we aim to create an integrated learning environment to give you a complete experience of English. Different people learn in different ways, so our teachers use a variety of methods, materials and technology to ensure that your lessons are stimulating and that you progress as quickly as possible.

All our courses for adults (except One-to-One) offer 21 full hours of classes and up to 14 hours of additional supervised self-access study and/or examination practice per week. They all offer the Hilderstone experience: excellent teaching, an intensive course, a lively social programme, and the chance to use your English and make friends with people from England and from all over the world.

Classes on our courses for adults are small – average 8 students, maximum 12 – and most operate with continuous enrolment. The minimum age is 16 on adult intensive English, Cambridge English qualifications, academic English and closed group courses, and 18 on teacher development courses.

Below is a typical timetable for one week of a course at Hilderstone College. Your own timetable may be a little different, but will certainly be as full and interesting as this.

Teaching Staff

One of the key strengths of the College is the quality of its teachers, who are carefully chosen for their qualifications and experience. Most have taught English in other countries as well as in the UK.

Teaching methods

Our teachers use a wide range of up-to-date materials and technology, and are constantly involved in the discussion and sharing of new ideas and the production of teaching materials, based on English as it is used today.
