

Introduction to CLIL Course (Secondary and Late Primary)

This course is a practical introduction to CLIL for primary (pupils aged 10+) and secondary teachers who are new to CLIL. The course is a mix of lectures and practical work- shops and provides participants with a working knowledge of the key concepts in CLIL and a selection of practical activities for both primary and secondary level. As a key element of success in CLIL is a teacher's language ability, the course includes language-development classes.
