#### **Course summary**

This course is aimed at non-native primary school teachers who are interested in enhancing students' motivation when teaching languages. This course will engage teachers in hands-on activities and interaction and provide them with lesson ideas that make students more interested in learning the language. Teachers will also have the possibility to brush up their own English, refresh and develop their teaching methods and learn about innovative techniques and approaches such as using critical thinking, CLIL and ICT tools in the classroom.

#### **Course requirements**

Teachers attending this course must have a minimum level of **B1 spoken English** (Intermediate or higher) and will be required to take a quick placement test on the first day.

- Experimenting with classroom techniques e.g. using authentic materials, using ICT, etc.
