- Have opportunities to refresh and improve your own English skills and knowledge
- Have the opportunity to live with a homestay host and explore the local area with an IPC guide on
 escorted trips to places of interest, experiencing language in its cultural and social setting
- Put course content into practice by delivering a course task with a colleague or colleagues
